

GP Fellowship Programme 2021/23



Introduction

Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin CCG is delighted to launch the 'New to General Practice Fellowship Programme', open to all new GPs who are within 12 months of receiving their Certificate of Completion of Training (CCT) after 1 January, 2021. The Programme is led nationally by NHS England and NHS Improvement, and delivered locally by our Primary Care Team.

The Programme is a national commitment within the NHS Long Term Plan, aiming to benefit GPs beginning their careers within General Practice. It will focus on working within and across Primary Care Networks (PCNs) leading to opportunities for integrated working and varied portfolio work experience. The timescale is two years (flexible around maternity leave, recognised commitments etc.), providing Continuing Professional Development (CPD) and both local and regional support to post-vocational training GPs in substantive posts (salaried or partners).

There is <u>national guidance</u> which provides an explanation of the ten components of the programme and information on the levels of available funding.

It has been agreed nationally that the GP Fellows' employers will be reimbursed to release the Fellows for one Fellowship session per week (pro-rata) for the duration of the two-year programme.

 Reimbursement is calculated at the individual GP's actual salary cost, plus an additional 30% toward on-costs of tax, NI and pension. The funded Fellowship sessions will provide each GP Fellow with opportunities to embed themselves in General Practice, work across PCNs, and will include funded time with a mentor as well as educational support, networking opportunities and academic sessions. Each GP Fellow will also have access to a bespoke Leadership Programme with integrated Quality Improvement activity.

The Programme is an excellent opportunity for our newly qualified GPs as they start their careers in General Practice.
